#### As We Gather

Transfiguration Sunday is the celebration at the end of Epiphany before Lent, remembering that Jesus descended the Mount of Glory and set his face toward Jerusalem (Luke 9:51). On Transfiguration Sunday, the Church says "farewell" to alleluias. The Church refrains from using her most jubilant words of praise during the muted celebration of Lent.

During Lent, the Church's worship assumes a more penitential character. The color for the season is purple, a color often associated with penitence. The "Hymn of Praise" is omitted from the liturgy. And again, the word "Alleluia" is usually (though not totally) omitted throughout the service and hymns as well. By not using the alleluia — a joyful expression meaning "Praise the Lord" — until Easter, the Lenten season is clearly set apart as a distinct time from the rest of the year. Additionally, it forms a powerful contrast with the festive celebration of Jesus' resurrection when our alleluias again ring loud and clear!





#### Goodbye to "Alleluia"

P When Jesus came down from the Mount of Transfiguration, he began to tell his disciples that he would be betrayed and crucified.

**C** Sometimes we lose sight of alleluia.

**P** Jesus did not return to glory before he stretched out his arms on the hardwood of the cross.

## **C** Sometimes in sorrow we lose sight of alleluia.

- P Then Jesus told his disciples, "If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me." (Matthew 16:24)
- **C** Sometimes we must let go of alleluia.
- **P** For the days of Lent, we discontinue singing and saying "Alleluia."

## **C** Sometimes, for a time, we forego alleluia.

(The children put their eggs in the bag and place the bag behind the altar)

**P** At Easter, we will again celebrate the Resurrection and say "Christ is risen. He is risen indeed, Alleluia!"

**C** In God's time, we proclaim Alleluia!



2 After six days Jesus took Peter, James, and John with him and led them up a high mountain, where they were all alone. There he was transfigured before them.3 His clothes became dazzling white,


whiter than anyone in the world could bleach them.


