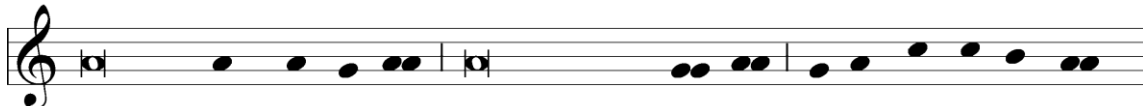

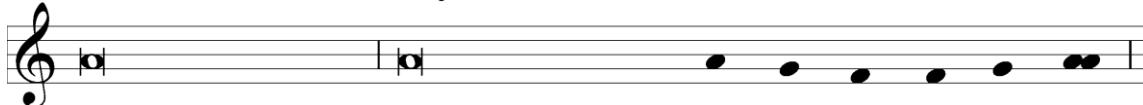

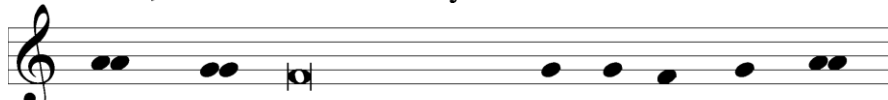

forevermore.

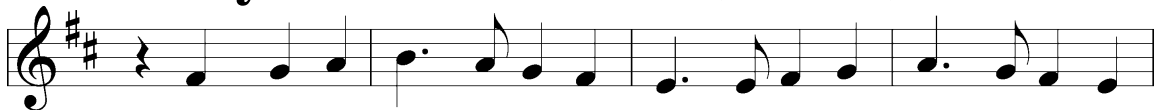

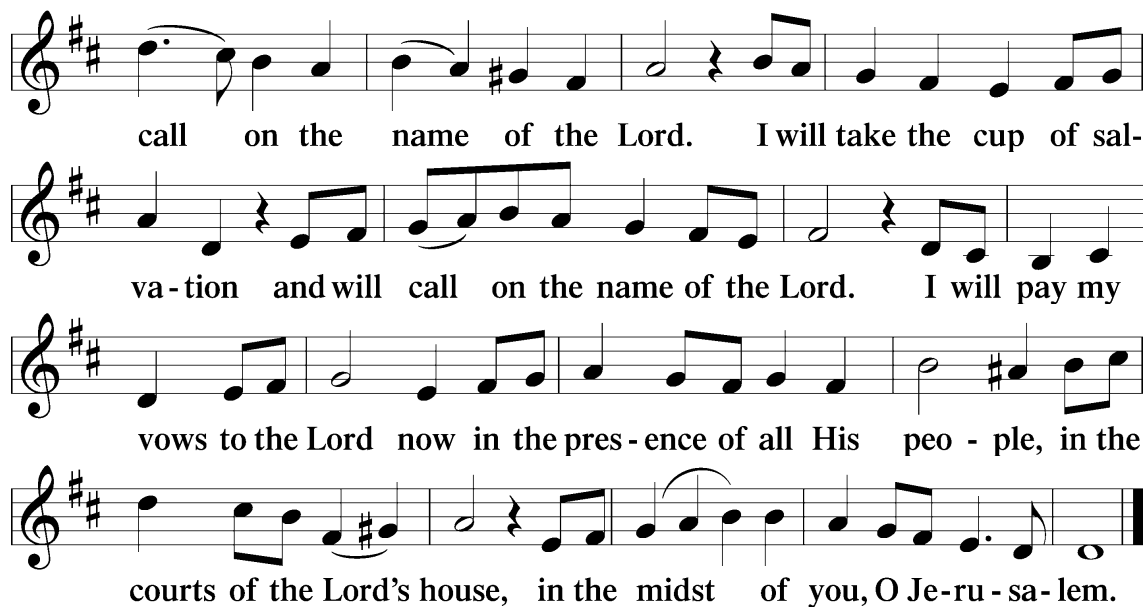
