



Untie it and bring it. 3 If anyone says to you, 'Why are you doing this?' say, 'The Lord has need of it and will send it back here immediately.'" 4 And they went away and found a colt tied at a door outside in the street, and they untied it. 5 And some of those standing there said to them, "What are you doing, untying the colt?" 6 And they told them what Jesus had said, and they let them go. 7 And they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks on it, and he sat on it. 8 And many spread their cloaks on the road, and others spread leafy branches that they had cut from the fields. 9 And those who went before and those who followed were shouting, "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! 10 Blessed is the coming kingdom of our father David! Hosanna in the highest!"

11 And he entered Jerusalem and went into the temple. And when he had looked around at everything, as it was already late, he went out to Bethany with the twelve.

The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven


and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty. From thence He will come to judge the living and the dead.

Hear our prayers for those for whom our prayers are requested, especially those who are sick and hurting, undergoing medical treatments and long-term care, and those who are sad and anxious. We also pray for the hungry and those who are homeless, those who struggle with anger, those who are mentally ill, and those who are

enslaved by addictions. Grant Your grace that is sufficient for all things, and Your divine healing when it is Your will – we pray especially for ______. Grant true faith to each of us to sustain us in life's trials. Lord, in Your mercy,

C hear our prayer.

P Eternal God, Jesus rode into Jerusalem on the foal of a donkey while the crowds sang cries of "Hosanna." Yet in a week's time, the same crowds would cry out, "Crucify Him. Crucify Him." Grant us true faith to sing the praise of Jesus today, and to sing the same praise each day. Protect us from our own temptations to grow weary and to turn away. Stir us with true faith to love Jesus and to follow Jesus until He returns in His glory. Lord, in Your mercy,

C hear our prayer.



forever and ever. Amen.




