Holy Communion is offered tonight:

The Lord's Supper is a "sacrament," a means of grace, by which God gives to us His mercy, grace, and new life. In the Lord's Supper, Jesus gives to us His body and blood in the simple vessels of bread and wine, with His word. Jesus says, "This is my body. This is my blood." When we receive the Sacrament in faith, we receive the gifts of forgiveness, *stronger* faith, and strength to live a new and holy life. God's Word teaches us to examine ourselves, to confess our sin, and to receive the Sacrament in faith, trusting in Jesus' word (*1 Corinthians 11:17-32*). The Scriptures also teach us to trust Jesus' Word that He is *really and truly* present for the gifts He gives. If you have any questions or doubts about the Sacrament, or other matters of life and faith, you can speak with Pastor Sippy before you commune. He will encourage you in this matter. We ask children who have not communed with us before to meet with Pastor Sippy so that he can prepare children for a faithful receiving of Jesus' gifts.

MY CLOSE FRIEND

Have you ever been betrayed by someone close to you? You are not alone. King David prayed in Psalm 41:9, "Even my close friend in whom I trusted, who ate my bread, has lifted his heel against me." To have a heel lifted against you is to receive a tremendous kick. It is a kick that sends you reeling and knocks the breath out of you—much like the feeling of being betrayed by a trusted friend. When trust has been broken, you can pray David's words as your own and put your trust in the One whose betrayal they prophesy. Jesus, too, knows what it means to be betrayed and is betrayed for you and me. He takes the pain and shame of betrayal upon Himself and gives to you and me His body and blood, forgiveness, hope, and peace. What a Friend We Have in Jesus!

+ CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION +

CONFESSIONAL ADDRESS

P Dear friends, Jesus says (*John 15:13*), "Greater love has no man than this, that he lays down his life for his friends." This Jesus does for you and me and all creation...

Even while we and all people fall short of friendship with Jesus, Jesus remains a friend to us. Romans 5:8 declares, "God demonstrates His love for us in this, while we were yet enemies of God, Christ Jesus died for us."

On this Maundy Thursday observance, let us remember the great humility and devotion of Jesus, who washes His disciples' feet and washes our sins away.

Maundy is an old English rendering of the Latin word, *Mandatum*, or commandment. Jesus says, "A new commandment I give to you, as I have loved you, love one another."

That we would receive the body and blood of Jesus faithfully and worthily, and that we would benefit from this eating and drinking, let us first examine ourselves in the mirror of God's Word, confess our sin and receive His forgiveness, and pray for the Holy Spirit to lead us in a new and holy life. (Silence for personal reflection. Lay before Jesus any hurts and worries, any anxieties, fears, and doubts that lay upon your heart; as well, lay any sin, guilt, or shame that burdens you; and meditate again upon Jesus' love for you: You are forgiven, even before you ask, and are reconciled to God.)

INVOCATION

The sign of the cross may be made by all in remembrance of their Baptism.

- **P** Fix your eyes upon Jesus,

C the author of our faith, and the One who makes our faith complete.

P Almighty God, Heavenly Father, we bow before you on this Holy Thursday remembering the love and friendship of your Son, Jesus. We confess our sins before you, and ask for the sake of Jesus that you would forgive us to be your friends and servants again:

C Almighty God and Father, we confess that we are by nature sinful and unclean. We have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. In our sin, we betray you. In our sin, we betray others. We have not loved you with our whole heart. We have not loved our neighbor as ourselves. But for the sake of your Son, Jesus, have mercy upon us. Forgive us, renew us, and lead us so that, by your Word and Spirit, we would live a new and holy life to the honor of Your name. Amen.

- **P** God be merciful to you and strengthen Your faith.
- **C** Amen.

P Do you believe that the forgiveness I proclaim to you is not my forgiveness but God's forgiveness?

C Yes.

P And do you believe that forgiveness is not only pardon for your sin but power and strength to live a new and holy life to God?

C Yes.

 P My dear friends in Christ, you are friends of Jesus. Jesus lays down His life in love for each of you and gives to you a new and holy life in His name. Therefore, in the stead and by the command of our Lord Jesus Christ, I declare to you: Your sins are forgiven in the name of the Father and of the → Son and of the Holy Spirit. You are a new creation. You can do all things through Christ who strengthens you.

P Blessed is the one who considers the poor!

OLD TESTAMENT READING

Exodus 12:1–14

P The Old Testament reading is from Exodus, the twelfth chapter.

1 The Lord said to Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt, 2 "This month shall be for you the beginning of months. It shall be the first month of the year for you. 3 Tell all the congregation of Israel that on the tenth day of this month every man shall take a lamb according to their fathers' houses, a lamb for a household. 4 And if the household is too small for a lamb, then he and his nearest neighbor shall take according to the number of persons; according to what each can eat you shall make your count for the lamb. 5 Your lamb shall be without blemish, a male a year old. You may take it from the sheep or from the goats, 6 and you shall keep it until the fourteenth day of this month, when the whole assembly of the congregation of Israel shall kill their lambs at twilight.

7 "Then they shall take some of the blood and put it on the two doorposts and the lintel of the houses in which they eat it. 8 They shall eat the flesh that night, roasted on the fire; with unleavened bread and bitter herbs they shall eat it. 9 Do not eat any of it raw or boiled in water, but roasted, its head with its legs and its inner parts. 10 And you shall let none of it remain until the morning; anything that remains until the morning you shall burn. 11 In this manner you shall eat it: with your belt fastened, your sandals on your feet, and your staff in your hand. And you shall eat it in haste. It is the Lord's Passover. 12 For I will pass through the land of Egypt that night, and I will strike all the firstborn in the land of Egypt, both man and beast; and on all the gods of Egypt I will execute judgments: I am the Lord. 13 The blood shall be a sign for you, on the houses where you are. And when I see the blood, I will pass over you, and no plague will befall you to destroy you, when I strike the land of Egypt. 14 "This day shall be for you a memorial day, and you shall keep it as a feast to the Lord; throughout your generations, as a statute forever, you shall keep it as a feast."

EPISTLE READING

1 Corinthians 11:23–32

P The Epistle reading is from First Corinthians, the eleventh chapter.

23 For I received from the Lord what I also delivered to you, that the Lord Jesus on the night when He was betrayed took bread, 24 and when He had given thanks, He broke it, and said, "This is My body which is for you. Do this in remembrance of Me." 25 In the same way also He took the cup, after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in My blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me." 26 For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until He comes. 27 Whoever, therefore, eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of profaning the body and blood of the Lord. 28 Let a person examine himself, then, and so eat of the bread and drink of the cup. 29 For anyone who eats and drinks without discerning the body eats and drinks judgment on himself. 30 That is why many of you are weak and ill, and some have died. 31 But if we judged ourselves truly, we would not be judged. 32 But when we are judged by the Lord, we are disciplined so that we may not be condemned along with the world.

HOLY GOSPEL

P The Holy Gospel according to St. John, the thirteenth chapter.

Glory to You, O Lord.

1 Now before the Feast of the Passover, when Jesus knew that His hour had come to depart out of this world to the Father, having loved His own who were in the world, He loved them to the end. 2 During supper, when the devil had already put it into the heart of Judas Iscariot, Simon's son, to betray Him, 3 Jesus, knowing that the Father had given all things into His hands, and that He had come from God and was going back to God, 4 rose from supper. He laid aside His outer garments, and taking a towel, tied it around His waist.

5 Then He poured water into a basin and began to wash the disciples' feet and to wipe them with the towel that was wrapped around Him. 6 He came to Simon Peter, who said to Him, "Lord, do You wash my feet?" 7 Jesus answered him, "What I am doing you do not understand now, but afterward you will understand." 8 Peter said to Him, "You shall never wash my feet." Jesus answered him, "If I do not wash you, you have no share with Me."

9 Simon Peter said to Him, "Lord, not my feet only but also my hands and my head!" 10 Jesus said to him, "The one who has bathed does not need to wash, except for his feet, but is completely clean. And you are clean, but not every one of you." 11 For he knew who was to betray Him; that was why He said, "Not all of you are clean."

12 When He had washed their feet and put on His outer garments and resumed His place, He said to them, "Do you understand what I have done to you?

13 You call Me Teacher and Lord, and you are right, for so I am. 14 If I then, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. 15 For I have given you an example, that you also should do just as I have done to you. 16 Truly, truly, I say to you, a servant is not greater than his master, nor is a messenger greater than the one who

sent him. 17 If you know these things, blessed are you if you do them. 18 I am not speaking of all of you; I know whom I have chosen. But the Scripture will be fulfilled, 'He who ate My bread has lifted his heel against Me.' 19 I am telling you this now, before it takes place, that when it does take place you may believe that I am He. 20 Truly, truly, I say to you, whoever receives the one I send receives Me, and whoever receives Me receives the one who sent Me."

21 After saying these things, Jesus was troubled in His spirit, and testified, "Truly, truly, I say to you, one of you will betray Me." 22 The disciples looked at one another, uncertain of whom He spoke. 23 One of His disciples, whom Jesus loved, was reclining at table close to Jesus, 24 so Simon Peter motioned to Him to ask Jesus of whom He was speaking. 25 So that disciple, leaning back against Jesus, said to Him, "Lord, who is it?" 26 Jesus answered, "It is he to whom I will give this morsel of bread when I have dipped it." So when He had dipped the morsel, He gave it to Judas, the son of Simon Iscariot. 27 Then after he had taken the morsel, Satan entered into him. Jesus said to him, "What you are going to do, do quickly." 28 Now no one at the table knew why He said this to him. 29 Some thought that, because Judas had the moneybag, Jesus was telling him, "Buy what we need for the feast," or that he should give something to the poor. 30 So, after receiving the morsel of bread, he immediately went out. And it was night.

Psalm 22

P C 1 My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? Why are you so far from saving me, so far from the words of my groaning?

2 O my God, I cry out by day, but you do not answer, by night, and am not silent.

3 Yet you are enthroned as the Holy One; you are the praise of Israel. 4 In you our fathers put their trust; they trusted and you delivered them.

5 They cried to you and were saved; in you they trusted and were not disappointed.

6 But I am a worm and not a man, scorned by men and despised by the people.

7 All who see me mock me; they hurl insults, shaking their heads: 8 "He trusts in the LORD; let the LORD rescue him. Let him deliver him, since he delights in him."

9 Yet you brought me out of the womb; you made me trust in you even at my mother's breast. 10 From birth I was cast upon you; from my mother's womb you have been my God.

11 Do not be far from me, for trouble is near and there is no one to help. 12 Many bulls surround me; strong bulls of Bashan encircle me.

13 Roaring lions tearing their prey open their mouths wide against me. 14 I am poured out like water, and all my bones are out of joint. My heart has turned to wax: it has melted away within me.

15 My strength is dried up like a potsherd, and my tongue sticks to the roof of my mouth; you lay me in the dust of death.

16 Dogs have surrounded me; a band of evil men has encircled me, they have pierced my hands and my feet.

17 I can count all my bones; people stare and gloat over me.

18 They divide my garments among them and cast lots for my clothing. 19 But you, O LORD, be not far off; O my Strength, come quickly to help me.

20 Deliver my life from the sword, my precious life from the power of the dogs.

21 Rescue me from the mouth of the lions; save me from the horns of the wild oxen.

22 I will declare your name to my brothers; in the congregation I will praise you.

23 You who fear the LORD, praise him! All you descendants of Jacob, honor him! Revere him, all you descendants of Israel!

24 For he has not despised or disdained the suffering of the afflicted one; he has not hidden his face from him but has listened to his cry for help.

25 From you comes the theme of my praise in the great assembly; before those who fear you will I fulfill my vows.

26 The poor will eat and be satisfied; they who seek the LORD will praise him – may your hearts live forever!

27 All the ends of the earth will remember and turn to the LORD, and all the families of the nations will bow down before him,

28 for dominion belongs to the LORD and he rules over the nations. 29 All the rich of the earth will feast and worship; all who go down to the dust will kneel before Him – those who cannot keep themselves alive.

30 Posterity will serve him; future generations will be told about the Lord.

31 They will proclaim his righteousness to a people yet unborn – for he has done it.

(We depart the sanctuary in silence, pondering the great mercy and love of Jesus, our Savior and Friend.)

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
